The Lake Eyre Yacht Club's 25th Anniversary Regatta is an 8-day event in total with 6 nights at regatta site and 1 night before and after at the Clubhouse or elsewhere at Marree. Dates have been chosen in the overlap of each State's September/October school holidays. The Regatta Camp is located on the southern shore of Lake Killamperpunna situated between the Birdsville Punt and the Birdsville Track. Two-wheel drive access should be available providing the Birdsville Track from Marree to Etadunna has no restrictions The event is for Lake Eyre Yacht Club members, families and friends only. We extend reciprocal rights to members of other boating clubs. You may join the Club as a "Gunna" prior to the event – details on our web site's Membership page.

WHERE?

All participants meet for a briefing the evening before departing to Regatta Camp the following morning.

Etadunna Pastoral Lease

The Regatta Camp faces NW on the southern shore of Killamperpunna with a low hill providing some shelter from southerly winds. Sunset views over the Lake and the opposite bluff can be dramatic. The lake has ample room for a traditional race triangular course and areas for adventure such as around the Birdsville Punt and the Birdsville Track where the second Birdsville Track Race will be held.

Presentation Night – Marree Hotel – publicans Brenton & Jacquie, Manager Simon Participants break camp and return to Marree and the Marree Hotel for the Presentation Night bringing the event to a close on the evening of 6 October.

GETTING THERE

The Birdsville Track should be open Mungerannie to Birdsville following the Diamantina flood. The Strzelecki Track should also be open by then but check road conditions and plan your trip before leaving. The Regatta Camp is a few hours comfortable drive up the Birdsville Track from Marree (135km).

EVENTS

In keeping with the Club's fun approach to yachting in the outback events will be laid back and not run under strict racing rules with emphasis on enjoying the rare privilege of sailing in the desert. We are family/children/pet friendly and do not tolerate anti-social behaviour. Pets to be always kept under control.

WHAT WILL BE SUPPLIED

- · Bush camp area with pit toilets.
- Firewood
- · Lake/river water for washing (do not drink).
- · Potable water now available at Clubhouse, Marree

WHAT DO I BRING?

- An off the beach sized yacht with appropriate safety gear as required by SA Marine Authority.
- Canoes and tinnies also permitted. Power boats for race supervision and rescue.
- Life jackets must be worn at all times when on the water.
- Outboards are allowed on yachts but must not be used when racing.
- While 2WD is OK with care a 4WD is preferred, particularly when towing.
- · Campers and off-road vans are OK.
- Trailers are often the weakest component. Consider beefing yours up and carry spare parts.
- Camping gear, gas cooking gear, food and drinking water.
- UHF handheld (waterproof or in waterproof bag). Channel 13 for club use, channel 4 for station emergency contact. UHF in vehicle an advantage.
- Starlink will be available but the more the merrier.
- Strong bags for rubbish and recyclables. Rubbish must be taken to Marree tip and cannot be disposed of in any way during trip. Recyclables left at Clubhouse. Penalties apply.

Camping conditions are warm to hot. Discomfort ruins a holiday so be prepared:

- Insects flies and mosquitos can be a real problem. Currently no mosquitos.
- Adequate clothing and bedding for temperatures from 10-30 degrees. Average minimum is 12 and maximum 28 degrees.
- Proper sun hat with tie, sunscreen essential
- Sunglasses essential and take a spare pair.
- · Wetsuits and spray jackets may be necessary.

HOW MUCH WILL IT COST?

This event is not intended to run at a profit. Main costs will include:

- Camping fee per vehicle (collected for the Station) \$210 for 6 nights at the Regatta Camp paid on registration at Clubhouse Monday 29 September.
- Camping is free at the Clubhouse for participants. Showers \$5.
- If you prefer more comfortable accommodation, please support our sponsor Marree Hotel, (08) 8675 8344
- Competing boat \$40 to supply fuel for race control, trophies etc.
- Briefing Meal at Roadhouse \$30 PP (mixed meats and vegetables, desert)
- 25th Birthday BBQ \$10 PP
- Presentation Night Meal at Marree Hall \$30 PP (Mixed grill and salads)
- Spectator half day \$20/vehicle, full day \$40/vehicle, day & camp \$50/vehicle,
- Bus/Tour Operator entry \$20 PP

THINGS YOU CAN DO TO HELP:

• We are looking for tinnie owners to help with race supervision, support and recovery.

IMPORTANT:

- All attendees and spectators must submit an entry form for each vehicle/boat and are subject varying fees paid before entry in cash.
- No firearms may be taken onto leases.
- No standing timber to be damaged.
- While firewood is provided it is suggested participants purchase a bag of firewood as very little is found in this area
- Cooking/heating comfort fires only NO BONFIRES as firewood and the environment is precious.
- Grouping of camps is mandatory to reduce firewood use and promote a community spirit.
- No generators. Solar panels, modern low power fridges and LED lighting are preferred.

- Children and pets are welcome but remember this is not a tourist resort. As there are many unfamiliar dangers in the desert they must be always supervised by their parents/owners.
- As is normal for adventure activities a liability waiver is required to be signed at registration.

Ask your local librarian for help to borrow the books. They are also often found in second-hand bookshops.


MAKE A HOLIDAY OF IT
